I would like to advise you of an email exchange I had with Rahim Jaffer on March 16th, 2010.

Mr. Jaffer, using an M.P. email account assigned to the office of Helena Guergis, requested information 'on behalf of constituents and close personal friends of Helena and I,' and as I had not spoken with him in quite a while, I requested a phone call.

His request was focused on the recent Budget announcement easing foreign ownership restrictions in the Satellite sector and specific questions on the Government of Canada's Long-Term Space Plan. In my role as Director of Parliamentary Affairs, I am charged with dealing with current issues rather than long-term strategic policy and I was therefore unable to provide him with any information. With that, the remainder of the discussion was kept to personal matters unrelated to Industry Canada or the government. At no time was any information provided to address his questions nor was any follow up information given. I have since not spoken with Mr. Jaffer.

Having worked in parliamentary affairs for 2 years while at Health Canada, I have working relationships with many Members of Parliament and their staff. Until Mr. Jaffer's 2008 defeat, I worked with him and his office on matters related to Minister Clement's portfolio.

Alos, some pathfinding is likely required - NRC/IRAP, NRCan and/or perhaps Envir Canada. One might ask the question where the GoA is on this, as no support is indicated.

It was great to talk to you yesterday and I look forward to golfing together in June. I am attaching a document to provide you with a working knowledge of the proposed technology development plan for the Alberta based producer (TransAlta) and distributor, (Enmax).

The proposal is for a canadian company RLP Energy Inc., in conjunction with the EERC, to carry out a full scale mercury capture test at Trans-Alta's Keephill utility site. The site will be prepared and offered by Trans-Alta and they will offer the required plant assistance to carry out the testing.

RLP Energy Inc., in conjunction with EECR, (Energy Environment Research Center), will carry out the actual testing at the plant. Enmax who is an interested party as they distribute the power generated there, will be a participant in this project and pay approximately \$500,000 USD towards its cost.

The DOE (US) is also a participant in the project and has agreed to contribute \$350,000 USD. It is desired that the Canadian Federal government, through Western Economic Diversification, invest approximately \$700,000 CDN as an active partner in the program.

BACKGROUND

Over the last year TransAlta has carried out a long-term mercury reduction testing program at the Keephill power facility with less than full success. The firm is required to meet the new Alberta mercury control regulations by the January 1, 2010 date and has yet to achieve the required reductions through the technologies tested. It is highly expected that the RLP Energy technologies in concert with the EERC knowledge, will be able to achieve the required capture rates. This will provide a definite benefit to the environment and enable Keephills to improve its overall emissions in the province.

In addition to improving the emissions in Alberta, this program will introduce a new technology called HEDT. This is a newly developed technology with the promise to further improve Alberta's air quality. A long-term license to the technology, for use in Alberta through Enmax and RLP Energy, will also be a result of this program.

As per our telephone conversation on April 12th, please find attached copies of three projects submitted by mail to my office by Green Power Generation, as well as all general correspondence with Mr. Jaffer or Mr. Glémaud.

To reiterate in writing, in June of last year, Mr. Jaffer and Mr. Glémaud stopped by my office on one occasion to inquire about the federal Green Infrastructure Fund. It was an unscheduled and informal meeting. I explained the mandate and general details of the Fund. They asked about the application process and I explained that project summaries were sent to my office and if projects fit the merit and eligibility requirements as laid out in the Fund's official mandate, the paperwork would be sent to Infrastructure Canada for further analysis and due diligence. If they were recommended by Infrastructure Canada, they would then go in front of the Minister of Infrastructure for approval. No specific projects were discussed and no commitments were ever made during this time or at any other time by any party regarding any possible projects and at no time did Mr. Jaffer or Mr. Glémaud ever ask for my support. To my recollection, this occasion was the only time I ever discussed the Green Infrastructure Fund with Mr. Jaffer or Mr. Glémaud in person or over the phone.

Over the course of the next three months, I received three project summaries from Green Power Generation. The first two projects were potentially eligible, and were therefore sent to Infrastructure Canada for further analysis while my office continued its own research. Subsequent to my office's research, it became clear that these two projects did not fit well within the mandate of the Fund nor would they provide a good return on investment for taxpayers. Consequently, I did not support or recommend any of these projects for potential funding under the Green Infrastructure Fund. The third project, received in the first week of September, I dismissed right away as it did not fit within the mandate of the Fund. None of these projects received funding and no further correspondence or discussion ensued from my office.

I found that my office exchanged three e-mails with Mr. Glémaud regarding the technology in question and one e-mail with Mr. Jaffer regarding the application process. I also exchanged an e-mail with Mr. Jaffer on August 26th of last year and forwarded it to my assistant. Since that time, I have not met with Mr. Jaffer or Mr. Glémaud nor have I spoken with them regarding their green infrastructure projects.

As per your request below, here is an update on the status of the project proposals you identified. Please let me know if you have any questions.

The Ridge Meadows Recycling Society - Proposal letter was reviewed and it is ineligible for GIF because of its very small size. A response letter has been prepared; it should be issued today or tomorrow.

StormFisher Biogas (biogas production and cogeneration) - Both Ontario projects have been assessed and neither was eligible, both are quite small and inconsistent with the objective of GIF to fund large-scale, strategic projects. In addition, it is not certain that the Listowel project falls within an eligible category of investment as it primarily involves biogas production. A note and a response letter have been prepared and are in approvals.

Green Power Generation (Kinetic Energy Project) - Project is being assessed and note prepared.

Green Power Generation (Solar Energy Project) - Project is being assessed and note prepared.

Canada Place Corporation (District Energy System) - Project is being assessed and note prepared.

"Bio3", Prairie Green Biofuels Inc. (Biofuel manufacturing) - Project has been assessed and is not eligible as there is no category for biofuel manufacturing under the Green Infrastructure Fund. A note and a response letter to this effect have been prepared and is in approvals.

Guelph District Energy Project (District energy system) - Project has been assessed and appears eligible; scale is smaller but is phase of one of a larger, regionally significant project. A note and a response letter indicating the proponent will be contacted if selected as a priority has been prepared and is in approvals.

Green Investment Group (Fort Mill du Portage - solid waste management) - Project has been assessed; eligibility is not clear. Appears to be a straight incineration project with electricity generation, because of environmental risks associated with incineration, public benefits are not clear. In addition, as described, this project would likely not achieve much in GHG emissions reductions since Quebec Hydro grid is practically 100% emissions free already. A note has been prepared recommending against identifying this project as a priority and a letter informing the proponent has been drafted. Both are in approvals.

All Peace Industries (new material) - The additional material was reviewed and assessed against the original analysis. The project is still not within an eligible category of investment and cannot be funded through GIF.



As such, we are looking at what some of those expenditures could be for the preliminary stages of our factory development. No doubt, the narrow window from now until March 2010 will make it a challenge to expend funds. However the more lead time we have on confirming federal funds the better position CS is in to plan this spending. Any assistance with the following questions would be very appreclated and helpful in our planning for the factory.

- Can you help provide us with any updated timeline for CS' application and a response from SODA?
- Are there are any possible concerns/questions you might being seeing?
- Is there a specific list of SODF qualified expenditures that might exist which we could look at or is the scope of expenditures fairly broad and flexible?

Thank you for any help in this regard and look forward to hearing back from you.



This is an easy one.

Green Power fits in with our Environmental objectives. It presently is not economic but the Provinical subsidies now make it look good. Using rooftops also is preferable to taking up prime land.

But the proposal that you attached leaves many questions and concerns. I'll skip over the competitive issue as I'm sure it will be treated by others.

My first concern is with our roofs. A PV installation is a serious project with wind loading and snow loading concerns and many requirements in addition to the panels (such as the inverter from DC to AC and many safety requirements). We'll probably need a new roof as part of the installation or we will be left with a seriously compromised roof service life.

This sentence below from the proposal indicates that they want to turn over the "key" to us. I don't think RPB should accept the "key". There is no mention of who is responsible for maintenance and operation of the PV installation. But I think I can guess. Of course, this is just another reason for competitive bidding since all of these issues can be explored in detail. Also the complications with leased buildings would just complicate these considerations.

"We are proposing to build complete turn-key solar power infrastructure to be mounted on the rooftops of various buildings owned or under long term leases by the Federal Crown in the Province of Ontario."

Instead of "can we use your roof?", this proposal seems to make us the proud owner of a new PV system. I doubt that we are ready for this and, if we are, this way of accomplishing it is not likely to give best value.

The meeting is requested by représentatives of the 'Réseau de développement économique et de l'employabilité' (RDÉE).

Persons who will be at the meeting:

Gilles Croze, Chairman of the Board for RDÉE Canada Roger Lavoie Executive Director for RDÉE Canada Frank Saulnier, Chief Executive Officer for RDÉE Alberta and Conseil de développement économique de l'Alberta. Rahim Jaffer, if he is available, due to his familiarity with the issues.

If there was to be changes, they would be communicated to who it may concern in order to respect the ministerial protocol requirements.

Mr. Rahim Jaffer has been asked to kindly lend his support to arrange this meeting because of his historical relationship with the requestor. He could also be part of the meeting if he so chooses.

A meeting was held last summer with the Honorable Monte Solberg, the Minister for Human Resources and Skills development Canada.

The meeting was positive but the subsequent management of the confirmed funds has been somewhat contrary to our understanding at the meeting and the follow up communication with Minister Solberg.

The use of funds was also confirmed before the Standing Committee on Official Languages (LANG) but the department officials have given an interpretation to their use which is very different than was understood from the Minister of the day and the Standing committee.

This difference of understanding is causing serious grief to the RDÉE network and in our opinion is opening an opportunity for adverse political difficulties. The interpretation of the expenditure of the funds by the department officials could also be cause for political liability.

Here are the points that we would like to see addressed at the meeting:

- We are deeply concerned that we have not had access to some level of inflationary compensation in the commitment of the new funds (69 million dollars for 5 years). We are still operating at the same level of funding that we were in 1999. When we discussed the inflation issue with Minister Solberg, he replied: 'We are on the same page on this one'. The department officials subsequently decided that we were not.
- 2. WE were also stunned to learn that the Department was going to take 9 million over 5 years for the administration of the program, meaning 1.8 million per year to administer 12 million dollars. We are of the opinion that this excessive given past experience and the level of money being managed.
- 3. We also need support to get some level of financial contribution to help some members of the RDÉE network deliver small business assistance to their francophone community. There is contribution support in the West through WED for the four francophone economic development organizations and some level of contribution in the Atlantic region through ACOA. Ontario and the North are financially disadvantaged and consequently their francophone communities are inadequately served in relation to small business development.
- 4. There is a question of horizontal support from some departments who could and in our opinion, should be contributing to the economic development of the network. This point is shared by some senior officials from other departments who believe that maybe, the key funder should be a department other than HRDC.

These are the 4 issues that are a priority for the meeting.

Not knowing your availability, we are at your disposal to meet. Given that two of us would be traveling from BC and Alberta, it would appear that 10, 11 or 12 August would be suitable. We understand that timing convenient to you will be positively received.
